*To the Senate :*

Gentlemen : I submit for your advice and consent the following nominations :

George French, of Washington county, for Circuit Judge of the Fifth Judicial Circuit of the State viz. Daniel Weisel, resigned.

Lawrence J. Brengle, of Frederick county, for Chief Judge of the Orphans' Court of said county, vice B. Amos Cunningham, resigned.

Philemon M. Smith, Justice of the Peace for Second Election District of Montgomery county, to fill the vacancy occasioned by his failure to qualify within the time required by Constitution.

Edward Harwood, Justice of Peace for Second District of Howard county, vice Timanus, resigned.

William B. Turbit, for Justice of Peace, for First District of Kent county, to fill vacancy occasioned by his own failure to qualify within the time prescribed by the Constitution.

John C. Charshee, for Justice of Peace for Second District, Harford county, to fill vacancy occasioned by his own failure to qualify within the time prescribed by the Constitution.

Marshall H. Carr, for Justice of Peace for Eighth District, of Anne Arundel county, vice Joseph McKenney, who failed to qualify within the time required by Constitution.
