made out by each of said enrolling officers, with an affidavit of the truth thereof annexed, and be approved by the respective commandants and forwarded to the paymaster general, for approval and settlement.

Enrollment Lists to be Transmitted.

SECT. 10.—It shall be the duty of the commandant of the militia in each military district to return to the clerk's office of the Circuit Court of the county within which such military district may be situated, or where said district is composed of more than one county, then to such county as may be the residence of the persons so enrolled, or to the clerk of the Superior Court of Baltimore city, where the persons enrolled reside in said city, an alphabetical list properly certified of the persons so enrolled in each of said military districts, or parts of districts, were the same is composed of more than one county, on or before the first day of April next succeeding the enrollment so made, and at the same time to transmit another copy of said enrollment to the adjutant general.

Notice of Enrollment.

SECT. 11.—Immediately on returning the enrollment to said clerk's office, it shall be the duty of each commandant to give notice that he has so returned the same, by advertisement published once a week for three weeks in all the newspapers printed in said counties respectively, or in the case of Baltimore city in three daily papers published in said city, daily for one week. And where no paper is printed in the county, then he shall give notice in two other papers of the State of the largest circulation in such county, and the filing of said list of enrolled men in said clerk's office, and the publication of such a notice shall be deemed and taken as against all persons so enrolled as due notice of their enrollment. And in said notice he shall also warn all concerned that unless they procure exemption from the board of exemption, as hereinafter provided, they will be required either to join the National Guard, within their respective districts on or before the first day of June ensuing, or to pay to said commandant, on or before that day the annual commutation hereinafter mentioned, or on failure to do so, that the payment of the same will be enforced in the manner herein authorized.

Penalty for Refusing Information.

SECT. 12.—Every resident of the State shall, when called on by the proper officer, give all information in his possession relative to the liability of himself or any other person to be enrolled under the militia law of the State, and every person refusing to give such information as aforesaid, shall be liable to a fine of not less than five dollars, nor more than twenty-five dollars, to be collected in the mode, and applied to the purposes hereinafter provided.
