Sect. 77.—Immediately after every parade and drill, the list of absentees shall be presented by the adjutant of every battalion or regiment, and by the orderly sergeant of every company, to the commanding officers thereof respectively.

Courts of Review.

SECT. 78.—The commanding officer of each battalion or regiment shall act, either in person, or by a field officer thereof, whom he may appoint, as a regimental court of review, to hear and determine excuses for absence from battalion drill or parade, by all field and staff, and non-commissioned staff officers, and company commanders.

SECT. 79.—Each company commander shall act as a company court of review to hear and determine excuses for absence from all drills and parades by the members of his company.

Sect. 80.—When any commander is himself reported delinquent, the court shall be held by the next in rank, not so reported, and in that case the list of delinquents shall be presented to such officer.

SECT. 81.—Such court shall be held within twenty days after each parade, and notice of the time and place shall be given by the court not less than ten days previously thereto, by advertisement set up at the company rendezvous, and published in some newspaper of general circulation within the district.

Compensation.

Sect. 82.—The officer holding said court shall be paid by the commandant of the district in which he resides, out of the fund of that district, four dollars for every day he may be employed in holding the court; the number of days being attested by his affidavit delivered to the district commandant, provided that the number of days for which compensation shall be allowed, shall not exceed fifteen days in any one year for each regiment or company.

Witnesses.

Sect. 83.—The said courts shall have power to administer oaths, to summon witnesses, and to enforce their attendance by attachment, which shall be served by any constable of the city or county in which the party resides, in the same manner and with the same costs as attachments issued by any justice of the peace are served.

Sect. 84.—Should any delinquent appear before said court, and shew cause why the fine assessed against him should not be paid, the same shall be remitted by the said court.

SECT. 85.—Should any delinquent, after due notice given

non-commissioned officers.
