

6. Harboring or protecting a known enemy. 7. Holding correspondence with the enemy. 8. Giving intelligence to the enemy. 9. Making known watchword. 10. Misbehavior before the enemy. 11. Violence to a superior officer. 12. Disobedience of orders. 13. Raising false alarm. 14. Forcing a safe guard. 15. Sleeping on post. 16. Compelling surrender to the enemy.

The above named offences are by the "*Articles of War*," made punishable with death, or such other punishment as shall be imposed by the sentence of a court martial.

*Other Offences.*

SECT. 147.—Every court martial shall have cognizance of the following additional offences :

1. For conduct unbecoming an officer and a gentleman when on duty, or to the prejudice of good order and military discipline.

2. For oppression or willful injury of any under his command.

3. For a combination or attempt to break, resist or evade the laws or lawful orders given to a person, or advising any person to do so.

4. For insult to a superior officer in the exercise of his office.

5. For presuming to exercise his command while under arrest.

6. For excusing, as commanding officer, any person under his command, for deficiency or unnecessary absence, or after the expiration of the time allowed by law.

7. For neglect or refusal to make a draft, detail or detachment, when legally ordered to do so.

8. For neglect or refusal to cause prosecutions to be commenced for fines, when it shall be necessary.

9. For neglect or refusal to make properly and transmit any return, roll, record, roster, certificate, account or document, at the time and in the manner required.

10. For refusing, as examining surgeon, to examine any claimant for exemption, when applying therefor in the proper mode, and complying with the prescribed conditions, and for charging or receiving any fee or gratuity for making such examination, except as herein prescribed.

11. For embezzling any public funds for which he may be accountable.

12. For selling, bartering, or misappropriating to his own use any public property in his possession.

13. For committing any act contrary to the provisions of
