September, a complete return of his company, alphabetically arranged, with the name, rank, age, residence, occupation and date of enlistment, whether by volunteering or draft, as the case may be, of each member thereof, and of each man discharged therefrom during the preceding year, together with the date of such discharge. The said return shall also contain a complete statement of the arms and accoutrements, and all other public property, for which said company commander may be responsible, their number, condition, and whether deposited in an armory, or distributed among the men, and whether receipts have been duly given for the same. It shall also state whether the company is uniformed, and how, and shall contain a record of the parades made by the company during the year, whether by company, battalion, brigade or division, battery or squadron, with the number present at each of said parades, and whether any active duty in the field, or in camp or garrison has been performed by said company, or any details or detachments for guard or other duty made therefrom since the last return, and the number of days of said duty, the marches, actions, or any other facts relating to the history of said company, according to the blank forms to be supplied by the adjutant general.

Company Rolls.

SECT. 173.—The rolls of the several companies shall, at all times, be open to the inspection of any officer of the regiment or battalion to which it may be attached, and to the commandant of the military district wherein the company, or any part thereof, is raised.

Company Order Book.

SECT. 174.—An order-book shall also be kept in each company, under the direction of the commanding officer, and the proceedings of the company, orders received and issued, and exact records of all details and detachments for guard or other duty, entered therein. Fines and forfeitures, with the time when, and the delinquency for which they were incurred, money collected by him, with the names of the persons from whom collected, shall be recorded in said book, which shall not be separated from the company, and be always open to the inspection of any member thereof.

ACTUAL SERVICE.

SECT. 175.—The power of calling out the State troops for actual service, vested in the commander-in-chief, shall only be exercised by him, except in those cases hereinafter expressly mentioned, and whenever he shall exercise that power, he shall issue such orders and take such measures for procuring and transporting the detachments, as the case may require, and for their equipment, subsistence and quarters, will appoint such quartermasters, commissaries and other staff officers as shall seem proper.
