Munn had the highest number of votes and was elected; in the Fourth Legislative District of said county, John W. Johnson had the highest number of votes and was elected; in Baltimore county, Ed-ward P. Fitch had the highest number of votes and was elected; in Calvert county, Charles H. Johnson had the highest number of votes and was elected; in Carroll county, James A. Hill had the highest number of votes and was elected; in Cecil county, Jacob Jones had the highest number of votes and was elected; in Charles county, John W. Johnson had the highest number of votes and was elected; in Dorchester county, the Electors had the highest number of votes and was elected; in Frederick county, Charles M. Hill had the highest number of votes and was elected; in Harford county, Wm. H. Hill had the highest number of votes and was elected; in Howard county, Hart B. Holton had the highest number of votes and was elected; in Kent county, David Jones had the highest number of votes and was elected; in Montgomery county, Thomas H.
