

Are you certain that you saw Mr. Waters and Mr. Woods raise a rebel flag?

Question. Describe the flag?

Answer. To the best of my knowledge there where two white stripes and one red stripe with three or four stars, I don't recollect which, I know I saw some stars; have seen the halyards of the flag suspended to the window of Mr. Waters' office.
