We hereby respectfully inform you that the Hon. Thomas Swann has been duly elected Governor of the State of Maryland, and the Hon. C. C. Cox Lieutenant Governor, and we propose with the concurrence of your Honorable Body the appointment of a Joint committee, consisting of two on the part of the Senate, and three on the part of the House, to wait on the Governor and Lieutenant Governor, to request their attendance in the Senate Chamber to-day, for the purpose of taking the oath of office in accordance with the requirements of the Constitution; the Lieutenant Governor at 11½ o'clock, A. M., and the Governor at 12 o'clock, M. We have appointed Messrs. Poteet, Rider and Smith of Somerset, on the part of this House.
