Referred to the committee on Finance.

On motion of Mr. Blackiston,

Leave was granted the committee on Corporations to report a bill to appoint and authorize certain persons in Kent county to purchase real estate in Kent county from Samuel E. Baker, of said county, to be held in trust for the Methodist Episcopal Church on Kent Circuit, for the purpose of holding campmeetings, or other meetings on the same, Sunday school festivals, &c.

Mr. Firey submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the Senate and House of Delegates of Maryland, That we recommend to the Congress of the United States the adoption of the Crittenden Compromise as it stood prior to its amendment;

Which was read the first time, and

Referred to the committee on Federal Relations.

Mr. Billingsley, from the committee on the Chesapeake Bay and its Tributaries, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to repeal an act to add new sections to the Code of Public Local Laws of Worcester county, under the head of oysters, reported it without amendment;

The bill was then read the second time, and

On motion of Mr. Goldsborough, of Dorchester,

Was ordered to be printed,

The bill entitled, An act to compensate George Vickers for legal services rendered the State in the case of the State against Albert Reed, (free negro);

Was read the third time and passed by yeas and nays, as follow:
