aforesaid proposition, he shall propose an armistice fordays for the purpose of effecting an amicable adjustment of our national difficulties upon the basis of an entire restoration of the Union, in all its original integrity.

Which were read the first time, and

Referred to the committee on Federal Relations.

On motion of Mr. Eichelberger,

Leave was granted Messrs. Eichelberger, Harrison and Whitaker to report a bill to repeal an act entitled, An act to divide the western poll of district No. 2 in Frederick county into two polls, passed on the 25th of June, 1861, chapter 74, and to divide said election district No. 2 into two polls.

The President appointed Mr. Denison on the committee on Finance, the committee on Judicial Proceedings, and the committee on the Constitution, in the place of Mr. Yellott.

The hour having arrived for proceeding to the election of State Treasurer, the ballots were deposited in the ballot-box, which was delivered to Messrs. Goldsborough, of Dorchester, and Jenkins, who, conjointly with the committee of the House of Delegates, retired, and after a time returned and reported that there had been 79 votes cast, of which Robert Fowler received 69 votes and Sprigg Harwood 10 votes.

Whereupon it was declared that Robert Fowler is duly elected Treasurer of Maryland.

The Senate adjourned.
