

Mr. Eichelberger, from the committee on Judicial Proceedings, reported a bill to repeal an act entitled, An act to repeal the 19th section of the 29th article of the Code of Public General Laws, and the proviso to the 33d section of the 5th article of the said Code, relating to the stay of execution, and to extend the time for enforcing the execution of judgments, passed by the General Assembly of Maryland at its extra session, on the 10th day of May, 1861.

Which was read the first time, and ordered to be printed.

Mr. Smith, from the committee on Judicial Proceedings, reported a bill entitled, An act to amend the 30th article of the Code of Public General Laws, so far as the same relates to forging bank notes, and passing forged bank notes, by repealing the 29th and 30th sections of said article, and enacting in lieu thereof, the sections herein following.

Which was read the first time and ordered to be printed.

Mr. Smith, from the committee on Judicial Proceedings, reported a bill entitled, An act to amend the law relating to indictments, by adding to the 30th article of the Code of Public General Laws, the following sections, relating to indictments for forging, or uttering forged instruments and for false pretences, and to the description of instruments in any indictment, so as to promote the ends of justice, that cases may be tried on their merits;

Which was read the first time and ordered to be printed.

Mr. Smith, from the committee on Judicial Proceedings to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to appoint an attorney to transfer certain bank stock, upon the books of the Cumberland City Bank, and for other purposes, reported said bill ought not to pass;

The bill was then rejected.

Mr. Smith, from the committee on Judicial Proceedings to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to add a section to the 19th article of the Code of Public Local Laws, in relation to the jurisdiction of justices of the peace of Somerset county, reported said bill ought not to pass;

The bill was rejected.

Said bill was then returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Goldsborough, of Dorchester, reported a bill entitled, An act to make valid certain deeds from Thos. J. Reddit, known as James Reddit, of Dorchester county, to James Reddit, of Dorchester county.
