

The President laid before the Senate a communication from Edward A. Marshall ;

Which was read, and

Referred to the committee on Finance.

Mr. Eichelberger, from the select committee, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to change the place of holding the elections in the 5th election district of Baltimore county, reported it without amendment.

The bill was then read the second time, and,

On motion of Mr. Eichelberger,

Three-fourths of all the Senators concurring,

Was read the third time, and passed by yeas and nays as follow :

Said bill was then returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Eichelberger, from the select committee, reported a bill for the relief of Joseph M. Ebberts, late sheriff of Frederick county ;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Eichelberger, from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, An act to divide election district No. 2 in Frederick county into two polls, and to repeal an act passed by the General Assembly on the 25th day of June, 1861, chapter 74 entitled, An act to divide the western poll of district No. 2 in Frederick county into two polls ;

Which was read the first time, and,

On motion of Mr. Eichelberger,

Three-fourths of all the Senators concurring,

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, An act to amend section 13 of article 98 of the Code of Public General Laws entitled, Wild Fowl, relating to the catching and killing of partridges,

Was taken up for consideration.
