On motion of Mr. Everett,

It was postponed and made the Order of the Day for Wednesday next, at 12 o'clock.

On motion,

Leave of absence was granted Mr. Denison.

The Clerk of the House of Delegates delivered a bill entitled, An act for the relief of Maranda Porter and Harriet Porter, of Carroll county;

Which was read the first time, and

Referred to the committee on Judicial Proceedings.

The bill entitled, An act to repeal the 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15 and 16th sections of article 84 of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to Schools;

Was considered and recommitted to the committee on Education.

The bill entitled, An act to amend the 42d section, relating to the granting of licenses to traders, of article 56 of the Code of Public General Laws, was taken up for consideration.

Mr. Eichelberger submitted the following amendment:

Amend the 1st section by striking out in line 4 the words "or to sell spirituous or fermented liquors."

Which was read.

Mr. Goldsborough, of Dorchester, moved to recommit the bill to the committee on Judicial Proceedings, with instructions to amend it so as to prohibit the issuing of licenses to sell spirituous liquors to any person under the age of twenty-one years, and to provide that when any married woman, to whom a license to sell spirituous liquors may be granted, shall violate the laws of this State, regulating the sale of such liquors, or shall keep a disorderly house, she shall be liable to indictment and prosecution in the same manner as if she was a feme sole.

The question upon its adoption was determined in the negative.

The question then recurred upon the amendment offered by Mr. Eichelberger;

Which was determined in the negative, by yeas and nays as follow:
