

The President announced the unfinished business of yesterday, being the bill relating to a Board of Police for Baltimore city.

The question was upon the following amendment reported by the Committee:

In line 46 on page 3, after the word "purposes" insert "the said treasurer of the board shall, every six months, on the first days of January and July, in each and every year, render to the said board of commissioners, an account of his receipts and disbursements, with the vouchers therefor, during said period, which account shall be verified by the affidavit of said treasurer, and the said commissioners shall thereupon examine said account, and if they find the same to be correct, shall certify said account, and send the same to the City Council of Baltimore city, within ten days after said account shall have been rendered by the treasurer, the said commissioners retaining a correct copy thereof, with a copy of their certificate, to be filed among the papers of their office;"

Which was read and adopted.

Mr. Goldsborough, of Dorchester, submitted the following amendment:

In line 6, strike out the words "as is hereinafter provided," and insert the words, "to be appointed by the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, and the said board of police."

Which was read.
