Said bill was then sent to the House of Delegates.

The bill entitled, An act to amend an act entitled, A further supplement to the act passed at January session, 1860, chapter 196, changing the commissioners appointed by the act of 1858, chapter 178, for cleaning out the Pocomoke river;
