

The bill entitled, An act to repeal the charter and wind up the affairs of an association called the Baltimore Corn and Flour Exchange, otherwise the Corn and Flour Exchange of the city of Baltimore;

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, An act to incorporate Rock Hill Academy, under direction of the Brothers of the Christian Schools;

Was read the third time.

Mr. Eichelberger submitted the following amendment:

Amend the 1st section by adding the following:

“Provided that all the corporators herein named, and their successors, shall comply with the provisions of article 4 of the Code of Public General Laws;”

Which was read and adopted.

The bill passed by yeas and nays, as follow:
