Referred to the committee on Corporations.

Leave was granted Messrs. Whitaker, Harrison and Bayne, to report a bill to make valid a deed from Joseph Trimble and William C. Haviland, trustees, to Rebecca Smith.

On motion of Mr. Eichelberger,

Leave was granted Messrs. Eichelberger, Whitaker and Goldsborough, of Dorchester, to report a bill to authorize the county commissioners for Frederick county, to borrow a certain sum of money to furnish the new court house.
