Amend the title, as follows:

"An act to authorize the Comptroller to examine and settle the accounts of the clerks in the several Tobacco Warhouses;"

Which were read and adopted, and

The bill was read the second time.

Mr. Bayne submitted the following order:

Ordered, That one thousand copies of the report from the State Agricultural Chemist be printed for the use of the Senate.

Mr. Blackiston submitted the following amendment:

Strike out "one thousand copies," and insert, "two thousand."

Which was read and adopted.

The question upon the adoption of the order was determined in the affirmative.

The bill entitled, An act to ratify the purchase and to provide for the organization and government of Druid Hill Park and Patterson Park, belonging to the city of Baltimore, by incorporating certain additional sections in article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws;

Was read the third time, and passed by yeas and nays as follow:
