Ordered by the Senate, That the Comptroller of the Treasury be requested to report to the Senate the amount of receipts into the Treasury, for the fiscal year ending the 30th of September, 1861, from the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad company; what part thereof, as paid in, accrued prior to said year; and what, from estimates in his department, will be the probable amount of revenue derived from said source for the fiscal year ending the 30th of September, 1862.
