A bill entitled, An act to amend the 23d section of the 38th article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to the bonds of Notaries;

A bill entitled, An act to amend the 56th article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to licences by adding thereto the following sections, requiring the sheriff of the several counties and city of Baltimore to report an alphabetical list of the persons required to take out licenses;

A bill entitled, An act to add new sections to article 30, of the Code of Public General Laws entitled crimes and punishments, to provide for the punishment of persons who may sell articles of merchandise being transported on canals, railroads, or highways, without the consent of the owner thereof;

Referred to the committee on Judicial Proceedings.
