Leave was granted the committee on Corporations to report a bill to construct a turnpike road, to be called the Maryland and Pennsylvania Turnpike Road Company.

On motion of Mr. Smith,

Leave was granted Messrs. Smith, Denison and Briscoe, to report a bill to make valid the sale of articles belonging to the State, made by Edwin M. Shipley, State Librarian, at Frederick, November 4, 1861;

Mr. Smith, from the select committee, reported said bill; Which was read the first time.

Mr. Lankford, from the select committee, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to change the name of Thos. Pratt Wright, of Somerset county, to that of Thos. Hicks Wright, reported it without amendment, and

The bill was read the second time.

Mr. Heckart from the select committee, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to incorporate the village of the Rising Sun, in Cecil county, Maryland, passed January session 1860, chapter 383, and to repeal the 165, 166, 167, 168, 169, 170, 171, 172, 173, and 174th sections, of the 8th article, of the Code of Public Local Laws, and substituting in lieu of said sections, the following sections, incorporating the village of the Rising Sun in said county, reported it without amendment;

The bill was read the second time.

Mr. Billingsley, presented the report of the Baltimore Female College;

Which was read, and

Referred to the committee on Education.

The bill entitled, An act to make valid a deed from Thos. Sofer and Arianne Sofer, to Jacob Durst;

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, An act to provide for transcribing one of the Record Books in the office of the Register of Wills for Allegany county;

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third Reading.

The bill entitled, An act to repeal section 354, article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, and to enact a new section in lieu thereof;
