On motion of Mr. Eichelberger,

Ordered, That the Secretary of the Senate furnish to the Governor of the State and to each judge of the Court of Appeals, a copy of the Daily Journal of the proceedings of the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Eichelberger,

Ordered, That the Comptroller of the Treasury furnish to the Senate an itemized statement of the disbursements under the Acts passed by the General Assembly of Maryland in 1861, chapter 10, section 1, chapter 66, section 1, and chapter 90, section 1.

Mr. Smith, from the committee on Judicial Proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to authorize the Court of Appeals to hear and determine at the present term thereof, the appeal of the State of Maryland, from an order lately passed by the Circuit Court of Baltimore city, in the cause therein, on the information of the State of Maryland against the Northern Central Railroad Company and others, reported it without amendment.
