REPORT:

The committee appointed by the Senate to confer with a committee of the House of Delegates, in relation to the Baltimore City Police Bill, respectfully report that the joint committee have agreed to recommend the passage of said bill, so amended as to reduce the number of police commissioners to two, instead of four, said two commissioners to be elected by the General Assembly on joint ballot, and to have each a salary of two thousand dollars per annum, and the police board to hold a session daily.

And the committee further recommend that the remaining amendments to said bill, heretofore adopted by the Senate, be adhered to by the Senate and concurred in by the House of Delegates.
