"To repeal so much of article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, as authorizes the persons named in section 807, to diburse the funds therein provided, and;"

Which was read and adopted;

Said bill was then returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Everett, from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, An act to amend the 1st article of the Code of Public Local Laws, by repealing sections 142, 146, 149, 151, and 155, relating to schools in Allegany county and substituting the following therefor;

Which was read the first time.

The Clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following message:

By the House of Delegates, February 12th, 1862.

Gentlemen of the Senate:

We repectfully request your Honorable Body to return to this House, House bill No. 67, relating to the inspection and measurement of cord wood, in the city of Baltimore.

Also, delivered the following report:

The committee appointed by this House to confer with the committee appointed on the part of the Senate, on the subject of the amendments proposed by the Senate, to the bill originating in this House, entitled, An act to repeal sections, 806, 807, 809, 810, 811, 815, and 821, of article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, relative to Baltimore city and the organization of a Board of Police therefor, and to reenact the same with amendments thereto, respectfully report:

That they have had a free conference with the said committee on the part of the Senate, and after a full interchange of opinion, have agreed with the said committee to recommend to this House:

- 1. That this House recede from its vote refusing to concur in the first amendment proposed by the Senate, and that the House concur in said amendment.
- 2. That this House adhere to its vote refusing to concur in the fourth amendment, proposed by the Senate, but concur in said amendment with the following amendment, to wit, add
