Leave was granted the committee on Judicial Proceedings to report a bill to amend the 16th article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to the power of the courts of Chancery to decree the sale of lands.

On motion of Mr. Jenkins,

Leave was granted the committee on Corporations, to report a bill to incorporate the Planters Bank of Charles county;

On motion of Mr. Sellman,

Leave was granted Messrs. Sellman, Denison and Townsend to report a bill to authorize an extension of the time of Eliza Jane Bassford, at the Institution of the Blind, in the city of Baltimore.
