

Mr. Denison presented the petition of Rebecca T. Neill, widow of Capt. Frederick T. Neill, praying for relief;

Which was read, and

Referred to the committee on Finance.

On motion of Mr. Sellman,

Leave was granted the committee on Judicial Proceedings to report a bill to be entitled, An act to authorize the trustees of Primary School district No. 19, of Anne Arundel county, to sell and convey the lot of ground on which the old school house is built and to select a site and build a new school house in a more central place in said district;

On motion of Mr. Denison,

Leave was granted Messrs. Denison, Sellman and Harrison to report a bill entitled, An act to repeal section 494, of article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, and to re-enact the following in lieu thereof, in relation to oysters.

Mr. Briscoe submitted the following message:
