

On motion of Mr. Jenkins,

Was committed to the committee on Corporations.

The bill entitled, An act to repeal an act passed by the General Assembly of Maryland on the 10th day of May, 1861, chapter 17, relating to the extension of the time for enforcing the execution of judgments and mortgages entitled, An act to repeal the 19th section of the 29th article of the Code of Public General Laws, and the proviso to the 33d section of the 5th article of the said Code, relating to the stay of execution and to extend the time for the enforcing of the execution of judgments;

Was read the third time.

“Section 2. And be it enacted that the provisions of the act be continued and be of force in the city of Baltimore for and during one year from the date of expiration of the original act;”

Amend the first section by striking out in line 9 the following:

“Provided that nothing herein contained shall apply to Baltimore city” and inserting “so far as the same applies to Frederick county;”
