On motion of Mr. Denison,

Leave was granted the committee on Corporations to report a bill entitled, An act to prohibit the placing, erecting or establishing of Gas Works or manufactories of Gas for illuminating purposes within the corporate limits of the city of Baltimore, without the sanction of the corporate authorities of said city thereto.

On motion of Mr. Smith,

The Order of the Day was postponed and made the Order of the Day for Monday, the 24th instant.

Leave was granted Messrs. Smith, Denison and Townsend to report a bill for the relief of John M. Walker, of Baltimore city.
