Mr. Townsend, from the select committe, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act for the relief of Harriet Nelson, of Worcester county, reported it without amendment, and

The bill was read the second time, and

On motion of Mr. Townsend,

Three-fourths of all the Senators concurring,

Was read the third time and passed by yeas and nays as follow:

The committee were discharged from the further consideration thereof.

Mr. Sellman, from the committee on Finance, reported a bill entitled, An act authorizing the Treasurer, on the warrant of the Comptroller, to refund certain sums of money, erroneously paid into the treasury by Clerks and Registers of Wills since the adoption of the present State Constitution;

Which was read the first time, and

Ordered to be printed.

The Clerk of the House of Delegates returned the following bills:

A bill entitled, An act to repeal article 17, of the Maryland Code of Public General Laws, referring to the office of the State Agricultural Chemist;

Endorsed, "passed by year and nays, with proposed amendments;"

Section 1st, strike out all after the word, "that," in line 2, and insert, "article 17, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, Agricultural Chemist, and relating to the office of Agricultural Chemist for the State be and the same is hereby repealed;"
