Mr. Lankford, from the committee on Finance, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to amend sections 947 and 949 of article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, of Baltimore city, relating to licensing of wood hucksters, reported is without amendment, and

The bill was read the second time.

Mr. Bayne, from the committee on Agriculture, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act for the protection of fowls and birds against hawks, owls, minks and weasels, reported it without amendment, and

The bill was read the second time.

Mr. Sellman, from the committee on Finance, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to prevent the adulteration of alcoholic liquors in the State of Maryland, reported said bill ought not to pass, and

On motion of Mr. Sellman,
