

Mr. Denison, from the committee on Finance, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to add to the 56th article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to licenses, the following sections, relating to Merchandise Brokers, and to amend the 17th section of the same article imposing a penalty upon Brokers acting without license, so as to include Merchandise Brokers, reported it without amendment, and

The bill was read the second time.

Mr. Heckart, from the select committee, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to repeal section 130, of article 8, of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to the collection of taxes, fines and forfeitures in the village of North East reported it without amendment, and

The bill was read the second time.

Mr. Goldsborough, of Dorchester, from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, An act to authorize the burgesses and commissioners of Emmittsburg to levy additional taxes for the purpose of making an artificial road of stone or sand in the streets of said corporation;

Mr. Everett, from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, An act to provide for the preservation and use of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal, and for the liquidation of its current indebtedness;

Which was read the first time, and

Referred to the committee on Finance, and

Ordered to be printed.
