Mr. Everett, from the committee on Corporations, reported a bill entitled, An act to incorporate the Maryland and Pennsylvania Turnpike Road Company ;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Goldsborough, of Dorchester, from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, An act to allow Robert Bell, late sheriff and collector of State and county taxes for Dorchester county, further time to complete his collections ;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Harrison, from the select committee, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to authorize G. A. T. Wright, collector of school tax in district No. 32 of Queen Anne's county, to complete his collections, reported it without amendment, and

The bill was read the second time.

On motion of Mr. Whitaker,

Leave was granted Messrs. Whitaker, Smith and Goldsborough, of Dorchester, to report a bill to appropriate a sum of money for the relief of William Kilgour, late Secretary of the Senate.

The bill entitled, An act to authorize the burgesses and commissioners of Emmittsburg to levy additional taxes for the purpose of making an artificial road of stone or sand in the streets of said corporation;

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, An act to add to the 56th article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to licenses, the following sections, relating to Merchandise Brokers, and to amend the 17th section of the same article, imposing a penalty upon Brokers acting without license, so as to include Merchandise Brokers ;
