Mr. Billingsley, from the committee on Revolutionary Claims reported a bill entitled, An act for the benefit of W. J. Emory, the legal representative of A. L. Emory, late of Queen Anne's county, deceased,

Which was read the first time.

A bill entitled, An act to prohibit the placing, erecting or establishing works or manufactories of Gas for illuminating purposes within the corporate limits of the city of Baltimore, without the sanction of the corporate authorities of said city thereto;

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, An act appropriating a sum of money as compensation to Neilson Poe for services rendered the State, as counsel, under the appointment of the Governor;

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, An act appropriating a sum of money to pay E. B. Watkins, widow of the late Col. Gassaway Watkins, a captain in the American Revolution, on account of pension money due and unpaid from the 16th day of July, 1840 to the 1st of January, 1852 ;

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
