On motion of Mr. Denison,

By unanimous consent the order appointing J. Deford a Director in the Bank of Baltimore was reconsidered and withdrawn

The bill entitled, An act to release William Delahay, former sheriff of Caroline county, from the payment of a balance appearing upon the books of the Comptroller of the Treasury to be due by him;

Was read the third time, and rejected by yeas and nays, as follow:

The bill entitled, An act to amend an act entitled, A further supplement to the act passed at January session, 1860, chapter 196, changing the commissioners appointed by the act of 1858, chapter 178, for cleaning out the Pocomoke river;

Was read the second time.
