

Mr. Lynch presented the petition of citizens of Baltimore county for the establishment of scales for the weighing of hay, straw, or other provender in the city of Baltimore, south of Baltimore street;

Which was read, and

Referred to Messrs. Lynch, Denison and Whitaker.

Leave was granted Messrs. Lynch, Denison and Whitaker, to report a bill providing for the establishment of scales for weighing hay and other provender, and straw in the western section of Baltimore city south of Baltimore street.

The bill entitled, An act to authorize the Treasurer, upon the warrant of the Comptroller to pay over to James W. Blackburn, late chief clerk in Tobacco Warehouse number 2, the arrears of his salary as such chief clerk;

The bill entitled, An act to amend the 55th article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to licenses by adding thereto the following sections, requiring the sheriff of the several counties and Baltimore city to report an alphabetical list of the persons required to take out licenses;
