

TUESDAY, March 4th, 1862.

Present at the call of the roll the following Senators :

Messrs. Goldsborough, Pt., Bayne, Blackiston, Briscoe, Denison, Eichelberger, Everett, Harrison, Heckart, Lankford, Sellman, Smith, Townsend and Willis.

Mr. Bayne presented the petition of citizens of Prince George's county, praying the opening of a road ;

Which was read, and

Referred to Messrs. Bayne, Eichelberger and Blackiston.

Mr. Eichelberger, from the committee on Corporations, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to repeal section 101 of article 26 of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to Corporations, and to insert in lieu thereof one other section, defining more certainly the rights intended to be secured to the Protestant Episcopal Church, reported said bill ought not to pass.

On motion of Mr. Briscoe,

The bill and report was ordered to lie over informally.

Mr. Eichelberger, from the committee on Corporations, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to incorporate the United Brewing and Malting Company of Baltimore, reported said bill ought not to pass.

And the bill was rejected.

Said bill was then returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Eichelberger, from the committee on Corporations, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to amend article 90 of the Code of Public General Laws, by adding thereto the following sections in relation to supervisors of roads, reported said bill ought not to pass.

The question upon concurring in the report was determined in the negative, and

The bill was read the second time.

Mr. Bayne, from the committee on Colored Population, reported a bill entitled, An act to authorize J. A. Thompson, of Queen Anne's county, to bring into the State of Maryland a bound negro boy ;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Smith, from the committee on Education, to which was referred the joint resolutions preparatory to the establishment of a uniform system of education for the State of Maryland, reported them without amendment, and

The resolutions were read the second time.
