Said bill was then sent to the House of Delegates.

The bill entitled, A supplement to an act passed at December session, 1822, chapter 57, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a wharf at the town of Cambridge, in Dorchester county, to authorise the stockholders of the said company to make sale of the wharf property of the company;

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading; and,

On motion of Mr. Goldsborough, of Dorchester, Three-fourths of all the Senators concurring,

The bill entitled, An act to repeal so much of article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws for the city of Baltimore as relates to the inspection of tobacco, commencing with section 495 and ending with section 551, both inclusive, and to add to said article under the head of Tobacco, new sections making the provisions for the inspection of tobacco;

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Whitaker, from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, An act to repeal sections 398, 400, 403, 405, 406, 407, 408 and 409 of article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws under the title of Guano and to re-enact other sections in lieu thereof;
