Leave was granted the committee on the Chesapeake Bay and its Tributaries to report a bill amendatory of the 16th section of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to oysters.

The bill entitled, An act to repeal an act entitled, a further additional supplement to an act entitled, An act to establish any incorporate a Medical and Chirurgical Faculty or Society in the State of Maryland, passed at June session, 1861, chapter 42, and to re-enact the same with amendments,
