

Mr. Sellman, from the committee on Finance, to which was referred the following bills :

A bill entitled, An act pay George Jacobi and others, the amounts due them by this State ;

A bill entitled, An act to amend the 268th section of the 93d article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to the accounts and payments into the Treasury of registers of wills ;

A bill entitled, An act making appropriations for the support of the Government for the year ending on the 1st day of January, 1864 ;

A bill entitled, An act to compensate Dr. Dennis Claude for performing the duties of Comptroller of the Treasury, under the appointment of the Governor, from the 22d day of July 1861, to the 18th day of October in the same year, and the clerk of said Comptroller, and other persons.

A bill entitled, An act appropriating a sum of money for the payment of the claims of Charles Reeder, Philip T. Tyson, and the estate of Thomas Gardner ;

Reported them without amendment, and

The bills were severally read the second time.

Mr. Smith, from the committee on Finance, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act appropriating a sum of money to pay the claims of John de la Camp, R. V. Clayton, B. H. Spencer, George Johnson, James S. Waters, E. G. Hyde, Hayward, Bartlett & Co., Samuel Stewart, J. C. Clayton, J. H. Skinner, Noah Porter, and others, reported it with the following amendments :

In section 1 insert before the words "James Sheehy" the words "Llewellyn Boyle, assignee of ;"

In section 1 strike out the words "to pay James S. Waters, or order, two hundred and fifty-one dollars and seventy-five cents, for stationery furnished by order of the State Librarian"

In section 1 strike out the word "Heegar" and insert the word "Hager ;"

Amend the title by striking out the words "James S. Waters" and by striking out the word "Heegar" and substitute the word "Hager ;"

Which were read and adopted, and

The bill was read the second time.
