The bill was read the second time.

The Clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following message:

By the House of Delegates, March 6th, 1862.

We have received the House bill entitled, An act to amend the 45th article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to husband and wife, by repealing the 17th section thereof and inserting another section, with the amendment proposed, which the House has refused to concur in.
