Mr. Denison, from the select committee, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to repeal sections 4, 5, 7, 13, 14, 15, 16, 20 and 25 of article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws, and to re-enact the same with amendments thereto relating to the time of the election of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, reported it without amendment, and

Three-fourths of all the Senators concurring;

It was read the second time.

Mr. Goldsborough, of Dorchester, from the select committee, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to compel free negroes to perform a limited amount of labor on the public roads and highways in Kent, Dorchester, Talbot, Charles, Calvert, Harford, Prince George's and Queen Anne's counties, reported it unfavorably;

The report was adopted and the bill rejected;

Said bill was then returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Lynch, from the select committee, to which was re-committed the bill entitled, An act to repeal sections 40 and 420 of article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws relating to weighing of hay and straw in the city of Baltimore, and substitute the following sections in lieu thereof, reported it without amendment, and

The bill was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading;

On motion of Mr. Heckart,

Three-fourths of all the Senators concurring;

Was read the third time and passed by yeas and nays, as follow:
