

FRIDAY, February 7, 1862—7½ P. M.

The Clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following message:

*By the House of Delegates,*

*Gentlemen of the Senate:*

We have received your message asking this House to return to your Honorable Body the bill known as the Grain Bill, and herewith return the same.

Which was read.

Also, delivered the bill to amend the 9th and 10th sections of the 18th article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to the clerks of courts, their accounts and payments into the Treasury ;

Which was read the first time, and

Referred to the committee on Finance.

The bill entitled, An act to enable C. S. Middleton, B. F. Gwynn, J. H. Sewalt, B. Tolson, J. T. Hoxton and E. H. Wivile, sureties upon the bond of D. Barry, late collector of taxes in Prince George's county, one year to complete his collections ;

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, An act supplementary to an act passed by the General Assembly of Maryland, at its January session, 1856, chapter 164, relating to the grading and paving of North Avenue in the city of Baltimore, and to make valid certain proceedings thereunder ;

Was read the third time and passed by yeas and nays, as follow:
