

THURSDAY, December 19th, 1861, 7½ P. M.

The Clerk of the House of Delegates delivered resolutions appertaining to the federal relations of the State of Maryland;

Which were read the first time, and

Referred to the committee on Federal Relations.

Also, the following bills:

A bill entitled, An act making an appropriation for the Executive Contingent Fund;

Which was read the first time, and

Referred to the committee on Finance.

A bill entitled, An act to repeal an act, to make valid the qualification of John Merryman, as First Lieutenant of the Baltimore County Horse Guards;

Which was read the first time, and

Referred to the committee on Militia.

A bill entitled, An act to repeal sections 806, 807, 809, 810, 811, 815 and 812 of article 4th of the Code of Public Local Laws, and to enact the same with amendments thereto;

Which was read the first time, and

Referred to the committee on Corporations.

Mr. Eichelberger submitted the following message:
