was referred the bill entitled, An act to amend the 7th section of the 22d article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to the office of the Comptroller;

The bill entitled, An act to amend section 1 of article 56 of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, licenses, relating to the issuing of licenses by clerks of courts;

The bill entitled, An act to authorize the Governor to have one hundred flint lock muskets, belonging to the State, altered to percussion lock muskets and to limit the cost thereof;

The bill entitled, An act to amend the 9th and 10th sections of the 18th article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to clerks of courts, their accounts and payments into the Treasury;

The bill entitled, An act to amend the 88th article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to sheriffs, by adding thereto the following sections, relating to accounts to be kept by the sheriffs, and returned to the Comptroller, and payments to be made by sheriffs;

Reported them without amendment, and They were severally read the second time.

Mr. Lankford, from the committee on Finance, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to prevent the adulteration of alcoholic liquors in the State of Maryland, reported said bill ought not to pass, and

Thé bill was rejected.

Said bill was then returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Willis from the committee on Militia, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to provide for the rapid organization of volunteers from Maryland, in case any further requisition for troops should be made upon the State by the President of the United States;

Also, the bill entitled, An act to repeal an act passed on the 20th June, 1861, at the extra session of the General Assembly, chapter 72, entitled, An act to make valid the qualification of Tench Tilghman as Major-General of the Second Division of Maryland Militia;

Reported them without amendment, and They were read the second time.

Mr. Bayne, from the committee on Agriculture, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of wheat flour, rye flour and corn meal in the city of Baltimore, and to prevent frauds on purchasers, reported it without amendment, and

The bill was read the second time.
