

after the passage of this act; cause a book to be opened in the city of Baltimore, for the purpose of receiving subscriptions to the capital stock of said Company, and the said books shall be opened for the above purpose within thirty days after the passage of this act, and be kept open for five days, and the said Company shall give notice of the time and place of opening said book in all the daily newspapers of said city ten days previous thereto; and in the event of more stock being subscribed for than said Company are authorized to issue the same shall be divided pro rata to each subscriber and that no one person shall subscribe for more than fifty shares of said stock, provided further, that each person so desiring to subscribe for said stock, shall before doing so take an oath or affirmation that his said subscription is bona fida, and for his own use and benefit;”
