On motion of Mr. Smith,
The Senate reconsidered the vote rejecting the bill.

The Senate took up for consideration the bill entitled, An act to repeal sections 806, 807, 809, 810, 811, 815 and 821 of article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws, and to re-enact the same with amendments thereto.

On motion of Mr. Smith,
It was postponed and made the order of the day for Monday, the 23d instant, at 12 o'clock.

Mr. Goldsborough, of Dorchester, from the select committee, to which was referred the preamble and resolutions in relation to interference by the General Government with the institution of slavery in the prosecution of the war, reported them without amendment;

The resolutions were then read the second time.

Also, from the select committee, reported joint resolutions appertaining to the federal relations of the State of Maryland, without amendment;

The resolutions were then read the second time.

Mr. Smith, from the committee on Judicial Proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to repeal an act entitled, an act to relieve the Mayor and the members of the Board of Police of the city of Baltimore, and all persons who acted under their orders in their efforts to maintain peace and good order and prevent further strife on and after the occurrences of the 19th of April, 1861, in said city, from prosecution for and in consequence of their acts of obedience to said orders, passed at the April Session, 1861, reported it without amendment;

The bill was then read the second time.

On motion of Mr. Eichelberger,
Ordered, That the President of the Senate be requested to
