have one of the committee rooms in the rear of the Senate Chamber fitted up as the President's room.

Mr. Willis, from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, An act to appoint an additional justice of the peace in election district. No. 2, in Caroline county;

Which was read the first time, and

Referred to the committee on the Constitution.

On motion of Mr. Eichelberger,

Ordered, That the Rev. Mr. Patterson be and he is hereby allowed fifty dollars for his services as Chaplain during the present session of the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Everett,

Ordered, That the Senate meet on Monday at half past ten o'clock, A. M.

Mr. Eichelberger, from the committee on the Constitution, to which was referred the bill entitled, 'An act to increase the number of constables and justices of the peace in Kent county, reported said bill "ought not to pass."

Which report was unanimously concurred in, and the bill rejected.

Said bill was then returned to the House of Delegates.

The Senate adjourned.
