

On the question being taken,

“Will the Senate advise and consent to the appointment of the several persons to hold civil commissions, agreeably to the nominations of Governor Bradford, on the 19th of February?”
it was

Determined in the affirmative—except the nominations of George W. Buckler, as Coroner for St. Mary’s county; to which the Senate refused to advise and consent; and the appointment of George Leddon, as State Wharfinger in Baltimore city; which

On motion of Mr. Goldsborough, of Dorchester,

Was recommitted to the committee on Executive Nominations.

On motion of Mr. Denison,

The Senate advised and consented to the appointment of Joseph Taylor, as an additional Auctioneer for Baltimore city, agreeably to the nomination of Governor Bradford, on February 22d.

On motion of Mr. Goldsborough, of Dorchester,

The Senate resumed the consideration of Legislative business.

Mr. Bayne, from the committee on Executive Nominations, to which was recommitted the nomination of George Leddon, as State Wharfinger, in Baltimore city, reported favorably thereon;

Whereupon, the Senate advised and consented to said appointment.
