1st day of October, 1857 to the 30th of September, 1861, and also the certificates for all the stock purchased for the said Fund from the 8th day of March, 1860 to the 30th day of September, 1861. The committee carefully counted the said bonds and certificates, and burned the same after comparing them with the entries on the Treasurer's books, and finding that the accounts had been correctly stated.

The certificates of stock purchased by the Treasurer for the Sinking Fund from the 30th day of September, 1857 to the 8th day of March, 1860, were not found in the Treasury, but the committee presumed that the same had been destroyed by the committee of the last Legislature, although their report has not yet been submitted.
