Which was read, assented to, and sent to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Everett,

Leave was granted Messrs. Everett, Firey, and Jenkins, to report a bill to appoint an attorney to transfer certain stocks, on the books of Cumberland City Bank.

On motion of Mr. Denison,

Leave was granted the committee on Corporations to report a bill to be entitled, An act to repeal certain sections therein named of article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to the police of the city of Baltimore.

Mr. Everett, from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, An act to appoint an attorney to transfer certain bank stock upon the books of the Cumberland City Bank and for other purposes;

Which was read the first time, and

Referred to the committee on Judicial Proceedings.

The bill entitled, An act to compensate George Vickers for legal services rendered the State in the case of the State against Albert Reed, (free negro);

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, An act to authorize the Comptroller upon the warrant of the Treasurer to pay to D. C. Blackiston, administrator of W. H. Blackiston, deceased, the sum of seventy-six dollars and five cents, due on over payment made to E. A. Moore, deceased, former State's attorney for Kent county, on State tax for 1845;

Was read the third time, and passed by yeas and nays, as follow:
